3. Discover ways to actively participate in open source!

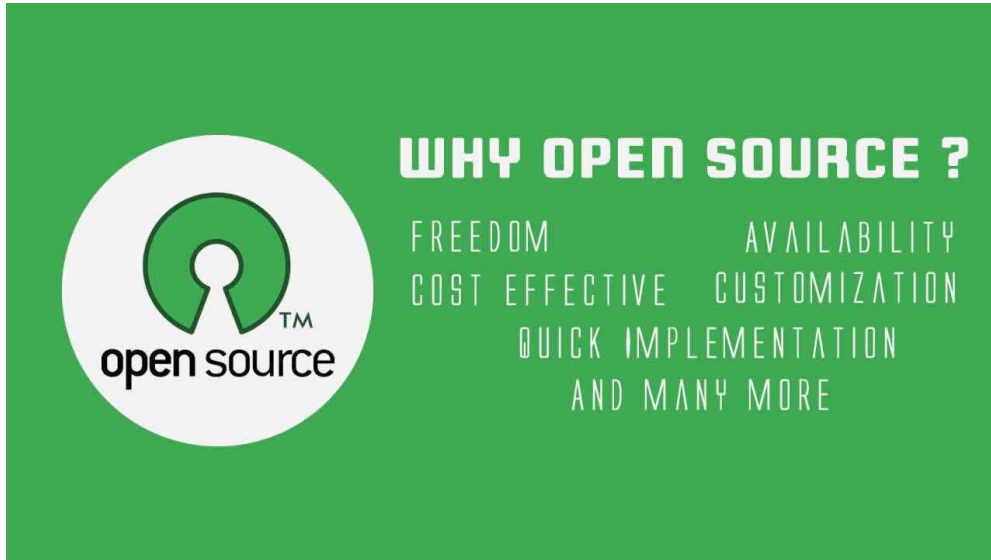
About the Presenter:
